**Key Phrases**

- ✓ *Weak in faith:* to allow \_\_\_\_\_ to erode and undermine belief.
- ✓ *Did not waver at the promise:* Abraham did not waver in \_\_\_\_\_.
- ✓ *Strengthened in faith:* When we act upon \_\_\_\_\_, our faith becomes stronger.
- ✓ *Being fully convinced:* Abraham fully believed God was \_\_\_\_\_ to do what He said He would do.
- ✓ *Accounted to him for righteousness:* Abraham's faith resulted in a \_\_\_\_\_ of righteousness.
- ✓ *But also for us:* What makes us righteous is not our \_\_\_\_\_, but simply exercising the kind of faith Abraham had.
- ✓ *Him who raised up Jesus our Lord from the dead:* The same power that rose Jesus from the dead is the same power that is able to provide \_\_\_\_\_.
- ✓ *Who was delivered up because of our offenses, and was raised because of our justification:* This is the great exchange – We give God our \_\_\_\_\_ and He gives us \_\_\_\_\_ through His son.
